



THE FOOLISH WOMAN




On a beautiful day at school,

"What are they?"







The students eagerly answered: "Surah Al-Ikhlās, Surah Al-Falaq, Surah An-Nas, and Surah Al-Kawthar."



However, the teacher noticed that Zaid's face had changed and he looked sad. He kindly asked: "Why are you sad, Zaid? What is troubling you?"




Zaid replied with sadness: "I have only memorized three suras, teacher."



The teacher asked: "Were you sick, Zaid?"






Zaid answered: "No, teacher. But on the fourth day, I felt bored and wanted to play with my new toy, so I stopped memorizing."

The students responded: "Reading Qur'an, helping our parents, and friends."


The teacher smiled and said:

The students answered: "No, teacher."






The teacher continued:
